# Abreu

David Abreu has been associated with many top Napa Valley vineyards like Bryant Family, Harlan Estate, and even Screaming Eagle. Abreu founded his own vineyard management company in 1980, working with at the time winemaker Richard Forman. They would frequently travel to Bordeaux to gain knowledge on vineyard management, farming techniques, and to further develop their winemaking philosophy. Abreu honed his skills for Bordelais farming style in the New World. In 1986, Abreu purchased his first vine which was the start of his own winery. David Abreu is a perfectionist with his clients' and his own wine, and it shows in his purely world-class wines.

In the 1980s David purchased Madrona Ranch, which he developed into vineyards and farmland. This is where it all started, and was the first property David ever purchased. With Madrona being a hugely diverse plot of land, many grape blending options were available to David, each with their own complexity of flavours.

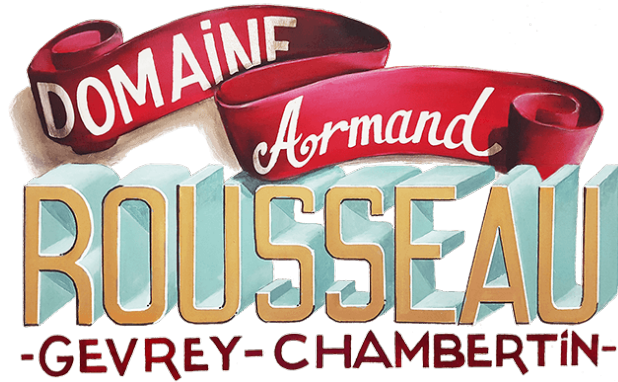
A little later, he purchased the Cappella vineyards, one of the oldest in St. Helena. Because of the diseased rootstock that lay there, it took David six years before he managed to grow the new vines into a healthy condition. He had tasted the Cappella fruit in the 70s, and new it would be worth the hard work.

Thorevilos was one of the places David spent a lot of his childhood. Situated between St. Helena and Howell Mountain, the soil there is perfect for grape growing. So David cultivated the land.

In 2000, David purchased Howell Mountain which sits at about 2000 feet elevation, and is surrounded by a protected pine tree forest. Before vine planting, David removed, stacked and preserved a large quantity of redwood stakes, for use in a later life. All the Abreu Vineyards are made up of Cabernet blends.

For four generations, the Rousseau family has worked tirelessly and passionately on some of the finest terroirs of the Côte de Nuits.

The domain is managed by Eric Rousseau, with the help of his daughter Cyrielle. It has expanded over the years and today covers 15 hectares and 3 ares. They own 3 hectares of Village appellation, 3 hectares 77 of Premier Crus and 8 hectares 52 of Grand Crus, situated in Gevrey Chambertin and Morey-Saint-Denis. From the moment the domain was established, the family developed an enduring ritual: the elders teach the ways of the vine the next generation. Thus, they maintain the strong bond between man and vine, upholding the family values and strong work ethic through the years. In the Rousseau family, the heartfelt love of the vines is renewed with each generation; a profound respect of the terroir is anchored in the family values.

Cyrielle Rousseau returned to join her father at the domaine in 2014. After obtaining degrees in Geology and Viticulture and the DTO in Dijon, she left Europe to learn about winemaking abroad. She assisted with harvests and vinifications in Oregon, Australia and New Zealand, and gained experience on the commercial side by working with wine merchants and importers.

Today, she manages the domaine alongside her father, who hands down his knowledge of the work and the vineyards, ensuring that the philosophy of the domain and the values of the family are passed down to yet another generation.

Chris Alheit of Alheit Vineyards is perhaps best known as the producer of cult wine Cartology, first produced as recently as 2011. Chris makes only white wines, focusing particularly on single vineyard Chenins from distinguished parcels of old vines. Together with his wife, Suzaan, he has created one of the most successful wineries in South Africa in less than a decade.

Alheit Vineyards is a family business started in 2010 by husband and wife team Chris and Suzaan Alheit. They met at Stellenbosch University, fell in love, travelled the world together, got married, then travelled some more. Eventually they settled on Hemelrand farm close to Hermanus and started their project.

Andremily started in 2012 with a commitment to crafting artisan Rhone-style wines focusing on distinction in California's Central Coast. There are currently three cuvees, the Syrah based, the Mourvèdre based cuvee and a third one called EABA (ee-buh).

# ·a·n·t·i·c·a· ·t·e·r·r·a·

Antica Terra is an 11-acre vineyard located on a rocky hillside in the Eola-Amity Hills of Oregon's Willamette Valley. The first vines were planted here in 1989 in a clearing within the oak savannah. The geology of the site is extremely unusual. In most of the region, vineyards are planted in the relatively deep, geologically young soils left behind by either the Missoula floods or the volcanic events that formed the Cascade Range. In this place, the remains of a far older pre-historic seabed rise to the surface, leaving the vines to struggle, without topsoil, amongst a fractured mixture of sandstone sown with fossilized oyster shells.

Above ground, the place is just as intense. Its exposed boulders, steeply pitched grades and panoramic views of the surrounding land convey a feeling of dramatic scale. The west wind moves constantly through the vines. Clouds fissure over the vineyard and allow the sun to ray through, at an angle and with a clarity that makes the site feel bright, even on the bleakest day. But it's what you can't see and feel, those aspects of the site that the vines allude to as they strive to find balance, that make it a remarkable place.

# DOMAINE BELARGUS

Domaine Belargus looks set to radically change perceptions of Anjou wines as one of the most exciting new-comers to the Loire Valley. The Domaine owns 24 hectares of superlative vineyards including “Coteau des Treilles”, “Clos des Ruchères”, “Les Quarts”. All are of “Grand Cru” quality if not strictly classified as such. Ivan Massonnat, owner of Belargus, has purchased icon Jo Pithon’s estate and consolidated it with other prime acquisitions in Anjou Noir.

In February 2018, Ivan, born in the Savoie region and working as an investor in Paris, fell in love with Coteau des Treilles, Jo's life's work. "Then, to make the long story short," Massonnat said, "the stars aligned and I was able to acquire some great terroirs in the area, notably 10 hectares in the Quarts-de-Chaume appellation, including the three plots listed in the original decree, and nearly three hectares in Savennières, including a small clos at the bottom of Roche-aux-Moines." And thus, the Domaine Belargus was born. The new estate is 100% dedicated to Chenin Blanc and celebrates the grape's versatility regarding terroirs and wine style. Ivan has installed a young team, and together they are currently converting to biodynamics, with a single-plot approach inspired by Ivan's "beloved Burgundy."

The winemaking is slow and as natural as possible. The grapes are picked at an optimal ripening point, and the fermentations take place in barrels, thanks to indigenous yeasts, and can last from a few weeks to more than a year, depending on each plot and the vintage characteristics.

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# BODEGA NOEMÍA PATAGONIA

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Bodega Noemia de Patagonia is an authentic project that brought Contessa Cinzano and Hans Vinding-Diers into the remote Rio Negro Valley of Patagonia. In 2000, they were inspired by the potential of the region after discovering exceptional wines from the 1930's and 1940's, cellared at the oldest winery in the area. A scouting mission of the Rio Negro Valley ensued, resulting in the purchase of the semi-abandoned Bodega Noemia property.

At 39 degrees latitude, Bodega Noemia is one of the southernmost wineries in the world. This region has a history of glaciers, poor soil and, limestone-rich bedrock. Flowing from the Andes, the Limay and Neuquen rivers bring mineral-rich water to this arid zone. A desert climate at heart, a large thermal amplitude graces the property, and the Andes bestow constant winds on the area, virtually eliminating the threat of most diseases. Combined, these factors create an environment that is ideal for making mineral-rich wines with vibrant hints of fruit.

The restoration of the vineyards began in 2001 with the goal of crafting fine wines that expressed the unique desert terroir. First planted in 1932, the original pre-phylloxera rootstock of the vineyards was carefully resuscitated, and Vinding-Diers oversaw the estate's Massale selections in order to create vineyard compositions tailored to the land. To further amplify the terroir's signature in the final wines, fermentation was carried out using only indigenous yeasts. The commitment to protecting this unique patrimony also led to the decision to cultivate almost all Bodega Noemia wines according to Argencert organic and Demeter biodynamic standards. The time and effort put into the vineyard has paid off with exceptional wines.

The debut of Bodega Noemia's 2001 vintage was a critical success and each subsequent vintage has followed with impressive results, making Bodega Noemia one of the most acclaimed properties in South America.

# BRYANT

## ESTATE

A true expression of the Pritchard Hill terroir, Bryant Family Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon was first released in 1992 and is culled solely from grapes grown on the estate's 13-acre vineyard. This First Growth wine conveys the long winemaking history of the region, a confluence of climate and soil plus a team of experts committed to nurturing its creation. Bryant Family Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon possesses ethereal aromatics and pure minerality that give focus and energy. The complexity of the site yields unusually dynamic wines for a single varietal. The wines of the mid-90s inform our current, somewhat more restrained approach towards crafting wines that demonstrate structural elegance, balance with good acidity and plush tannins — all elements that make them very age-worthy.

Seductive. Margaux-like femininity. Full-bodied. Opulent. This is how critics describe BETTINA, Bryant Estate's beautifully layered and complex blend of four Bordeaux varietals: Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot and Petit Verdot. Sourced from David Abreu's exceptional estate vineyards — Madrona, Thorevilos and Las Posadas—the differing elevations and soil compositions give BETTINA wonderful structure and dimensionality. This blend has evolved into an irresistibly hedonistic powerhouse.

Originally released in 2009, DB4 could be described as the precocious younger sibling of the Bryant Family Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon. Young and playful yet silky and supple, this meticulously crafted blend marries a variety of grapes from David Abreu's Madrona, Thorevilos and Las Posadas vineyards with Bryant Estate fruit. DB4 is hands-down one of the finest Napa Valley wines in its price range, making it infinitely pourable.

*Bruno Giacosa*

Consistently considered as one of the greatest winemakers in the world, Bruno Giacosa is the third generation to produce wine at the family estate which was founded in 1871. Under the “Casa Vinicola Bruno Giacosa” name he initially he produced a variety of wines made only from purchased grapes from selected vineyards.

In the 1980s he bought the Falletto vineyard in Serralunga d’Alba and began producing the Barolo Falletto, and later on, also the Barolo Falletto Vigna Le Rocche.

While many producers are content on focusing either on Barbaresco or Barolo, Giacosa has been creating a steady stream of impressive wines from both areas for nearly half a century.

Regardless of the wine in question, the Crus bottled in the best vintages were given the iconic Red Label. The white label releases are still widely regarded to offer soaring quality. If a wine does not meet Giacosa’s expecting standards, he does not bottle it.

Giacosa only made The Red Label Riserva a few times each decade, and they are not only fantastically complex, rich and powerful wines capable of decades of development; they are also endowed with that rare and magical sense of extra dimension found only in the greatest wines. Bruno Giacosa’s standards were so high that, over the decades, he deemed only a few wines worthy of wearing the Red Label. As a consequence, his more typical white label releases often offer such soaring quality that we find ourselves asking why they weren’t given the Red Label.

Founded by Ann Colgin in Napa Valley 25 years ago, Colgin Cellars' reputation is rooted in four wines; ***Tychson Hill, Cariad, IX Estate, and IX Estate Syrah***. The winery is located at the northern end of IX Estate in the Pritchard Hill area of Napa Valley and offers views of Lake Hennessey. Since its creation, excellence and quality have been at the heart of Colgin Cellars' entrepreneurial journey. The winery's success was built on its ultra-premium, limited production wines, all of which are consistently highly rated by several industry sources. The wines are sold primarily through an exclusive client list and also distributed to high-end restaurants and retailers in the US and over thirty countries globally.

The **2017 Colgin "IX Estate"** beams from the glass with a feeling of purpose and a sense of place. In its youth, this vintage has continually shown enhanced soil driven aromas such as iron and graphite along with the sappy wild sage that grows in the periphery of this site. Raspberry and marzipan combine with juniper and nutmeg, adding complexity at every sip. The 2017 "IX Estate" offers a balance of firm yet pleasurable structure and a harmonious succulence. The 2017 "IX Estate" retains focus and purity combined with heightened acidity ensuring it will last for decades.

DOMAINE  
DHONDT - GRELLET  
CHAMPAGNE

One of the most exciting emerging talents of the Côte de Blancs is Adrien Dhondt, born in 1991, whose cellars are located in the sleepy village of Flavigny, a mere four-minute drive from more-glamorous Avize. This small estate came into being in 1986, when Adrien's father, Éric Dhondt, married his mother, Édith Grellet. The Dhondts were Belgian farmers in origin, the Grellets, by contrast, are natives of Cuis and Cramant.

An autodidact, Adrien Dhondt believes in living soils, practicing what he calls "peasant viticulture." While he has thus far eschewed organic certification, he employs no synthetic products of any kind, cultivating his soils and periodically enriching them with homemade compost. In the vines, there's a lot of manual work: Dhondt prunes short and debuds severely to limit yields and produce ripe, concentrated fruit at harvest time, a commitment that's immediately evident in the glass.

In the cellar, Dhondt is a partisan of barrel fermentation with ambient yeasts, filling his *fûts* after a very short six hours' settling (or *débourbage*) and adding minimal sulfur dioxide. His cellar isn't air-conditioned, so it fluctuates in temperature throughout the year, tracking the seasons; and the *vins clairs* spend eight months on the lees before *tirage* without cold stabilization, filtering or fining. During those eight months of *élevage*, the wines are topped up when Dhondt deems it judicious, "about every month and a half, I'd say, but I decide whether to top up—and whether to perform *bâtonnage*—by tasting."

Today, the Dhondt-Grellet range begins with a non-vintage cuvée named Dans un Premier Temps. It's a blend of roughly 50% Chardonnay from the Sézannais—half of which ferments in barrel, the rest in tank—with 30% tank-fermented Pinot Noir from Avenay Val d'Or in the Vallée de la Marne and 20% tank-fermented old vine Pinot Meunier from Cuis.

Next come three non-vintage Blanc de Blancs bottlings. From Cramant comes Le Bateau, a wine that derives from a parcel that was planted in 1951 by Dhondt's great grandfather and follows the contours of the slope, some 70% of it exposed south, the balance to the north. There's also a Cramant Grand Cru cuvée, assembling *lieux-dits* La Garenne—defined by deep, atypically sandy soils in the heart of the village—and Les Longues Verges, an early-ripening site that produces deep and concentrated wines. From a number of small parcels scattered around Cuis, Dhondt produces Les Terres Fines, appropriately one of his most fine-boned cuvées. And the range concludes with another Cuis wine, this time a vintage bottling, from *lieu-dit* Les Nogers. This is a continuation of the hillside that produces Le Bateau in Cramant on the other side of the communal boundary, and Dhondt's parcel begins with sandy-clay, becoming chalkier as one ascends the slope.

For many years, Larry McKenna was fuelled with the desire to craft a Pinot Noir that was purely dedicated to expressing the unique vineyard characteristics, collectively known as terroir, of the Martinborough Terraces. In 2003, treading in the historic footsteps of Burgundy where Larry developed his passion for Pinot Noir, he turned a tiny amount of grapes from his low-yielding Te Muna Road vineyard into what is now one of New Zealand's most revered wines, **Kupe**. From the outstanding 2006 vintage Larry added a further two exceptional sites that he knew offered unique qualities that would shine through the resulting wines. These are **Kiwa** and **Te Rehua**. Together, these three wines portray the essence of the Martinborough Terraces.

### Kupe Vineyard

An innovative planting in Escarpment's Te Muna Road vineyard. A high density planting gives a unique opportunity for Abel clone to express its self in a distinctive manner. The 1.8ha site surrounds the Huangarua escarpment relying on a soil type laid down by the river circa 75,000 years ago. The combination of deep alluvial gravels, own rooted plants with very high leaf to fruit ratios and Martinborough's warm dry summers creates wines of exceptional power and style. This combined with essentially traditional winemaking techniques secures Kupe as the signature wine for Escarpment's Pinot Noir endeavours. It is at the vanguard of Pinot Noir style in New Zealand

### Te Rehua Vineyard

This vineyard has a very clear style expression evolving from a traditional planting approach. Geoff Bunny sourced as many clones of Pinot Noir that were available in 1990 and planted them at random in the 1.1ha site. Diversity in planting material is an important part of Terrior producing more complexity and an array of fruit flavours in the resulting wines.

### Kiwa Vineyard

Planted on the Martinborough Terrace alluvial gravels in 1989 by Graham and Gill Cleland this 2ha site is one of the finest in the district. It consistently produces wines with pure expressive Martinborough style. Vine age, good shelter and a blend of UCD Davis clones 5, 6 and 13 merge into classic wines of great depth and character. The hallmark of this vineyard is the savory, earthy undertones combining with beautiful ripe black, red and green fruit flavours which are always expressed in the resulting Pinot Noirs. These characters are consistent from year to year ensuring the Terroir is paramount in the bottle.

## HUNDRED ACRE



### HUNDRED ACRE, NAPA VALLEY

Hundred Acre is the ultra-premium cult Napa Cabernet project of Jayson Woodbridge, owner, vintner and visionary. His motto is concise, “stand amongst the very best or not at all”.

Each step of the winemaking process, from hand picking in numerous passes, hand sorting berry by berry, to the forest and age of barrels are carefully selected and measured.

Everything is hand crafted, hand pruned, scrutinized and aligned for his desired response. Each Cabernet Sauvignon represents single estate vineyards from Napa Valley: Kayli Morgan, Ark and Few and Far Between.

*“Robert Parker once called him the “Howard Hughes of wine,” and I don’t think he was wrong with that description. Putting the wealth aside, Jayson Woodbridge thinks on another plane of existence, and this alone makes a lot of folks uncomfortable. That his unconventional ideas and ways of doing things clearly get the results only compounds the prevailing notions of a kind of mysterious, unseen, dark matter element that accounts for his success. I would say he’s a little like Howard Hughes with a good measure of da Vinci.”*

# Kinsman Eades

Kinsman Eades is the maiden wine project of Shae and Nigel Kinsman, crafting small-lot, classically proportioned Napa Valley cabernet sauvignons. Turning to winemaking as a second act to music, Nigel's passion for cabernet sauvignon took him from Margaret River to Tuscany, then finally to Napa Valley as winemaker for Eisele Vineyard (nee Araujo Estate Wines). Meanwhile, Shae's epicurean heart saw her train under Australia's top sommeliers before pivoting to wine business studies. Relocating to Napa Valley in 2006, she joined cult producer, Abreu Vineyards, before she and Nigel began making wine for their eponymous label in 2016. Building their reputation on single-vineyard expressions from compelling, and often under-the-radar vineyards, the Kinsmans' mindful farming and restrained winemaking chart the course. Intent on amplifying the voice of the land, theirs is a pursuit of authentic character over perfection.

## RHADAMANTHUS

*Co-fermented blend of cabernet sauvignon, cabernet franc and petit verdot from the former Reverie Vineyard on Diamond Mountain.*

The former Reverie site on Diamond Mountain is an old, terraced vineyard drenched in sunlight at 800 feet elevation. Planted in the early 90s, cabernet sauvignon, franc, malbec and petit verdot vines have been bolstered by St George rootstock for near-on three decades. The contoured rows cling to frighteningly steep south and west-facing slopes of rhyolite and tuff, producing berries both diminutive and thick-skinned. In this extreme terroir, the vines naturally yield a low 1.8 tons/acre, resulting in wines that are undeniably mountainous in their framework, girth and power.

## ANJEA

*100% clone 22 cabernet sauvignon from the Sleeping Lady Vineyard in the Yountville AVA.*

Meticulously farmed by the Bettinelli family, Sleeping Lady Vineyard lies on an alluvial fan of dark, gravelly loam endowed by the towering Mayacamas Mountain Range to its west. As the southernmost vineyard in Yountville - one of Napa Valley's southern AVAs - the site benefits from the San Pablo Bay's cool afternoon breezes and chilly morning fogs. It has the best of both worlds - intense sunny days yet cooling influences to retain acidity and freshness. A pure, delineated fruit character and firm framework are hallmarks of this site.





## LA VOLEUSE DU CHAGRIN

*100% Eisele Clone Cabernet Sauvignon from the Geeslin Vineyard in the Calistoga AVA.*

Geeslin Vineyard is a charming 1.4 acre plot in Calistoga's eastern reaches where flows from Simmons Creek have laid alluvial deposits over millennia. This profound terroir is defined by deep, sandy soils laden with river stones, contributing in no small way to the elegance and poise that mark these wines. Planted by the neighboring Araujo family to Eisele Clone cabernet in the mid-90s, the fruit was an integral component of that iconic wine for decades.

Fifth-generation Napa natives, Maggy and John began their endeavor in the 1970s planting The Judge vineyard on the Kongsgaard family land near Napa. The inaugural Kongsgaard wines came in 1996. They now produce The Judge, Chardonnay, Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah, Viognier, Sauvignon Blanc and Albaniño in their underground winery—a cave dug into the volcanic rock, high on the eastern rim of the Napa Valley where we have planted a spectacular mountain vineyard. John and Maggy also direct the farming under long-term contracts on several perfect acres in the Napa Carneros and near the winery. These intensely farmed, shy-bearing vineyards and our traditional low-intervention winemaking produce powerful, graceful wines—vivid expressions of vineyard and variety. Production is limited to what Maggy and John, with their son Alex, can make with our own hands.

Domaine Leroy is arguably producing the greatest red **Burgundy wines** on the Cote d'Or at present. **Lalou Bize-Leroy** started out as a négociant, working for her family's **Maison Leroy**, which was founded by her father, **Henri**. There are three entities to the Leroy empire: the Maison Leroy based in Auxey-Duresses; the Domaine d'Auvenay named for Lalou Bize-Leroy's own home near St-Romain, and the substantial Domaine Leroy in Vosne-Romanée.

Lalou Bize-Leroy also owns a quarter of **Domaine de la Romanée-Conti**, where she was co-director until the other shareholders ousted her in 1992, partly because she had started a competing winery. In 1988 Lalou Bize-Leroy purchased the **Domaine Charles Nöellat** in Vosne Romanée and renamed it **Domaine Leroy**, which included the buildings and cellars which are now the domaine's headquarters, and a wonderful array of vineyards including Richebourg, Romanée St Vivant, Clos de Vougeot, premiers crus Vignerondes and Boudots in Nuits and Beaumonts and Brulées in Vosne. The following year further vineyards were purchased from Domaine Philippe Remy, including Clos de la Roche, Latricières-Chambertin and Le Chambertin, while further holdings have been added since.

The domaine has been farmed biodynamically from the start and is now certified by ECOCERT. It was not always easy and the 1993 vintage was certainly a catastrophe with rampant mildew – but they had nobody but themselves to blame, for being behind in their treatments, according to Madame.

The next exciting, if controversial, move was the change in training system for the vines. For some time previously the hedging (*rognage*) of the vineyards had been done by hand rather than more abrasively by machine. However it is not natural for the vine to be cut back and it affects the vine's performance both in the current season and the following year, so now, after the flowering, when the shoots are lengthening, they are curled over instead of being cut back. This minimises *entrecoeurs* and second crop bunches forming, as well as leaving the vine happier and healthier. Nobody could have doubted the well-being of the Leroy vines on the eve of the 2008 harvest.

Horses however are out. Domaine Leroy was among the first to start using horses to plough the vines, but managing the artisans who own and operate the horses proved insurmountable. At one point five different operators were being employed and they still could not be guaranteed to be there at the necessary moment. Now Leroy use little Caval tractors which weigh less than a horse.

Lalou Bize-Leroy has 23 hectares of vines, mostly Premier and Grand Cru classified. In the vineyard Lalou practises biodynamism as well as severe pruning and crop-thinning. The result is ridiculously low yields.

Domaine Leroy is blessed with a heritage of ancient vines, in part because Lalou Bize-Leroy never grubs up and replants. Instead she replaces individual missing vines, from her own cuttings, but never too many at once in a given vineyard. These old vines combined with her training and pruning policy, restricting the bunches to just four per vine, explain in part the



concentration of Leroy wines. The average yield across appellations and vintages at Domaine Leroy is around 16 hl/ha, according to Lalou.

In the cellar there is no winemaker (*vinificateur*) nor oenologist, André Porcheret not having been replaced when he left after the 1993 harvest. The grapes are of such quality that they do not need a winemaker! After rigorous deselection on the sorting tables, which employ as many people as there are pickers, the grapes are placed, stemmed and all, in wooden fermenting vats. After fermentation the wines are matured in new barrels from Cadus and François Frères.

*“Leroy, absolute perfection. More than a model, the wines are an absolute reference. No other winery in the world holds itself to a higher standard in terms of exactitude in its viticulture. This unique winemaker lives for her vines and nothing else. Every new vintage is, for her, an event to live up to each year: produce, from the lowest possible yields, wines that are the absolute voice of their terroir.”*

## Maison Leroy

Maison Leroy is the original foundation of Lalou Bize-Leroy’s Burgundy empire, which now includes Domaine Leroy and Domaine d’Auenay. The wines are released only when they are ready to drink and offer a more affordable entry-point to Leroy. The négociant operation was founded in 1868 by François Leroy. While he owned vines in Auxey-Duresses, Meursault, Pommard, Chambertin, Musigny, Clos Vougeot and Richebourg, the wine had never carried the Leroy name, being sold through Comptoir des Propriétaires de la Côte d’Or. François’s son Joseph expanded the business significantly, adding a distilling arm that grew further under the next generation, Henri.

Henri joined the business in 1919. He was a close friend of Edmond Gaudin de Villaine and his wife and brother-in-law, Marie-Dominique and Jacques Chambon, who inherited Domaine de la Romanée-Conti (DRC) in 1912. It was a difficult period for Burgundy and the Chambons were looking to sell the estate. Henri convinced the Chambons to retain control and sell him a 50% stake in the property in 1942. Henri focused his attentions on DRC and was key to turning round its fortunes, making it one of the world’s most sought-after names.

While Henri was in charge, the négociant business ticked along, however it is under his daughter, Marcelle Bize-Leroy, but known universally as Lalou, that the Leroy name has become



synonymous with the best Burgundy. She joined the Maison Leroy team in 1955, taking over running the operation from her father in 1971.

Based in Auxey-Duresses, Maison Leroy is today a central part of the Leroy portfolio providing a wealth of wines hand-selected by Madame Lalou Bize-Leroy herself. Her lifetime of experience as a winemaker producing wines from almost every appellation in the Côte d'Or makes her one of the most experienced vignerons and tasters in the region.

She selects the Maison wines by blind tasting hundreds of wines each year, choosing only the best. She does this with no ties or obligations to buy from growers, allowing her to pick wines purely based on quality. It is well known that she pays a premium for the wines she chooses, to allow herself to cherry-pick the greatest expressions of each terroir. Bize-Leroy stakes her considerable reputation on her expert palate and market knowledge, selecting all the Maison's out-turn entirely from what she has tasted.

Following the initial selection process, the wines are aged at the domaine and selected for release when she believes the wines are ready. This is one of few néogicants that can offer 20-, 30- or 40-year-old wines that have lain unmoved in the cellar since bottling.

Each February, fans of the estate wait anxiously to hear which wines are destined to be released that year, often themed around anniversary bottlings that tend to be between 10 and 50 years old. Find details of recent releases below.

## Domaine Leroy

For many, Domaine Leroy represents the pinnacle of fine Burgundy. Owned and run by the legendary Lalou Bize-Leroy, the domaine in Vosne-Romanée is one strand of the Leroy empire, along with Maison Leroy and Domaine d'Auvenay.

Bize-Leroy (born 1932) joined her father at Maison Leroy in 1955 and dedicated her time to studying Burgundy's vineyards, developing an encyclopaedic knowledge of the region's terroir. Her father Henri Leroy owned 50% of Domaine de la Romanée-Conti (DRC) at the time and focused his energies on this venture. She took over managing Maison Leroy in 1971. Having accompanied her father on his weekly visits to the estate, she took over managing DRC – a role shared with Aubert de Villaine – in 1974. While there, she was integral in raising the status of the domaine to its now astronomical level. However, for reasons that have garnered much speculation, Bize-Leroy left in 1992, turning her attention solely to Domaine d'Auvenay, Domaine Leroy and the original Maison Leroy. Today she still has a 25% stake in DRC.

As Bize-Leroy started to find it more difficult to find wines that were worthy of the Maison Leroy label, she decided to expand the property's vineyards. Domaine Leroy was formed when she purchased Vosne-Romanée's Domaine Charles Noëllat in 1988. Domaine Charles Noëllat had impressive holdings in both the Grands Crus (Richebourg, Romanée-Saint-Vivant and Clos de Vougeot) and the Premiers Crus (Vignerondes and Boudots in Nuits-Saint-Georges, Beaumonts and Brulées in Vosne-Romanée). In 1989 she expanded by absorbing Domaine Philippe Remy, adding vines in three further Grands Crus – Clos de la Roche, Latricières-Chambertin and Chambertin.

Bize-Leroy sold shares in Maison Leroy to Japanese luxury department store Takashimaya in 1988 to finance the creation of Domaine Leroy. It is for this reason that the domaine's Coteaux Bourignons Rouge and Blanc have been exclusively sold in Japan ever since.

Today the domaine consists of just over 21 hectares, with extremely impressive holdings across nine Grands Crus and eight Premiers Crus, as well as village and regional vineyards. Everything is farmed biodynamically, and has been since 1988.

Famously Madame Lalou Bize-Leroy doesn't identify herself as a winemaker; the wine makes itself. The challenge for her is providing the highest quality grapes to the winery and this is where all the effort is concentrated at the domaine. Alongside DRC and sister winery Domaine d'Auvenay, Domaine Leroy produces the most exclusive and highly sought-after wines in Burgundy. Across the vintages and throughout the entire range, their tiny output and immense quality mean an almost perfect storm where supply can never meet demand. This means that, inevitably, allocations disappear into private cellars immediately upon release, and there is great demand for any stock that surfaces on the secondary market.

# lillian

After training in the Sine Qua Non cellar for eight years, Maggie Harrison got the chance to produce her own label from a small portion of the prestigious White Hawk Vineyard in Santa Barbara County. With that, she released the first vintage of 2004 Lillian Syrah and has continued to produce wines from the vineyard as well as the Bien Nacido Vineyard in Santa Maria Valley, and the Stolpman Vineyard in the Santa Ynez Valley. The wines are fermented with native yeasts and are unfinned and unfiltered which further adds to the finesse and elegance of Lillian.

Lillian Syrah is made from fruit sourced from three vineyards. White Hawk gives the darkest and most deepest fruit of the three sites. Complexity, comes as floral and iodine (ocean) related perfumes rather than a more typical bacon fat, and pepper oriented profile. This fruit usually encompasses about 50% of the blend. Each year Stolpman sells Maggie two tons of their best fruit. Usually this is T99 clone Syrah (producing very thick skins) and something from one of their high density plantings. The calcareous soils at Stolpman mean the fruit profile is slightly brighter and more tannic. This is usually 10-15% of the blend. Bien Nacido is a large historic vineyard planted closer to the coast. It is far cooler than Stolpman or Whitehawk and it is evident in the wines. This is more Northern Rhône-like in its flavours: it's all about bacon fat, smoke, olives, lavender and crazy salt inflected oceanic aromas. Maggie's Lillian wines are extraordinary things: a fusion of elegance, gossamer lightness of touch and subtlety with intensity, concentration and power.

## DOMINIO DE PINGUS

Pingus was established in 1995 by Peter Sisseck, who had already made a name for himself as winemaker at [Hacienda Monasterio](#). He located three separate plots, each containing very old vines of [Tinto Fino](#), and established the winery. His aim was to produce "an unmistakably Spanish, terroir-driven wine... a garage wine."

Peter's tiny production of fewer than 500 cases comes from three parcels of ancient, head-pruned Tempranillo vines. His true genius is demonstrated in the vineyard. The gnarled old vines have been carefully husbanded back to health - the trunks straightened, lowered, and pruned back to 1-2 buds per stump. Yields range from a high of 20 to an incredibly low 9 hl/ha.

"Tinto Fino is important," he explains. "A lot of cuttings of Tempranillo have come in from Rioja, so not all vineyards in Ribera del Duero are Tinto Fino. There is a difference. All the vines in my plots are very old. They have never been fertilised nor treated with pesticides and all grow following the traditional en vaso system. They are perfect." After fermentation in steel of large wooden vat, the wines are raised in 100% new French oak.

Dominio de Pingus has founded a joint project with local grape producers to make an old vine tempranillo called "PSI".

# PHILIPPONNAT

CHAMPAGNE

For almost five hundred years, the Philipponnat family has left its mark on the soil of the Champagne region. Generations of men and women have cultivated the land at Ay, the family's home since the time of Apvril le Philipponnat who owned vines at *Le Léon*, between Ay and Dizy, in 1522. In the 16<sup>th</sup> century the family's ancestors were winegrowers and merchants, suppliers to the court of Louis XIV, magistrates and Royal Mayors of Ay - a town which was directly dependent on the Crown since the era of the Counts of Champagne. Today it is the sixteenth generation, in the form of Charles Philipponnat, which presides over the House.

Established in the heart of the Champagne wine-growing area, Philipponnat possesses a unique heritage. Its magnificent historic 18th century cellars were part of the Château de Mareuil. Philipponnat has owned an exceptional walled vineyard, unparalleled in the Champagne wine-growing area, for nearly a century: Clos des Goisses. The name of this 5.5 hectare plot with a 45° slope reflects its nature: in the old Champagne dialect, *Gois* or *Goisse* means a very steep slope. It is also the region's warmest terroir: facing due south, this pure chalk slope receives no shade from sunrise to sunset.

Philipponnat's expertise is particularly apparent in its use of the solera process. This technique is a very long-standing House tradition; it consists of keeping reserve wines in oak barrels and including them in non-vintage blends (in a proportion of one quarter to one third) and using this blend as a reserve wine for the following blend. Philipponnat was the first Champagne House to indicate the main year used in its non-vintage blends, the dosage and the date of disgorgement on back labels, informing consumers and wine experts of the characteristics of each cuvée.

A portion of the wines is fermented or matured in casks, which is exceptional for Champagne; aging in wood gives them greater complexity without in any way coarsening them. Wines are aged in the bottle on lees for three to eleven years. With a distinctive style that does not yield to trends, the House produces a range of Champagnes which are, first and foremost, wines: flavourful, powerful and well-balanced. This perfect balance between intensity and freshness is maintained with a low dosage. Philipponnat stores the older vintages "neck down" in the Caveau du Trésor, to be disgorged on request after a long aging period.

The Philipponnat collection offers a full range of wines to be enjoyed on all occasions: each cuvée is well-suited to accompany haute cuisine. The range of three non-vintage and three vintage cuvées is rounded off by the prestige cuvées: **Cuvée 1522** and **Cuvée 1522 Rosé, Clos des Goisses** and **Clos des Goisses Juste Rosé**.



### «L.V.» Long Vieillesse (long ageing)

« L.V. »: these two letters conceal treasures preserved by Philipponnat since the end of last century. Like a hallmark, they are a sign of recognition for lovers of unique champagnes.

The L.V. Collection reveals Clos des Goisses L.V., Grand Blanc L.V. and Réserve Millésimée L.V., the House's most memorable cuvées, aged from 15 to 20 years. Available in very limited quantities (only a few hundred bottles for each vintage), each collection is disgorged six months before being released for sale. Presented in a numbered wooden box, the bottles and magnums are available for purchase through Philipponnat's network of loyal ambassadors. Kept for 15 to 20 years in the depths of Philipponnat's cellars, the L.V. Collection adds the complexity of champagne aged in the best conditions to the wine's characteristic freshness. The wines are protected from any oxidation by prolonged contact with the lees before their disgorgement. The very low, extra-brut dosage gives full expression to the aromatic personality of each vintage.

# CLAUDE RIFFAULT

## S A N C E R R E

At barely 30 years old, Stéphane Riffault (Claude's son and now the owner of the estate) is turning out Sancerre bottlings that are the envy of many producers twice his age. As David Schildknecht put it, "make no mistake: this address in the hamlet of Maison Salle (Sury-en-Vaux) is now one of the five or six most exciting estates in the Sancerre appellation." Given that Stéphane's holdings represent 4 tenths of 1 percent of the appellation, this kid is clearly doing something right.

Based in the village of Sury-en-Vaux, the Stéphane Riffault works 33 different parcels in 8 different lieu-dits spread across 4 villages. The 13.5 hectares of vines are plowed, and no synthetic material is used and starting in 2017, the property has been certified organic by ECOCERT and biodynamic by BIODYVIN. Unlike most Sancerre producers, the entire harvest is carried out by hand, and extensive sorting occurs before the grapes are crushed. Stéphane's wife, Benedicte, leads the harvest team while Stéphane manages the sorting and press during harvest.

Most of the domaine's holdings are planted on the soft limestone soil called *Terres Blanches* with some parcels on *Calliottes* and *Silex*. Small, judicious uses of oak help to add length to the already precise, site-expressive, and vertical bottlings. All of the parcels are vinified separately, and with the exception of the rosé, all the wines are bottled unfiltered.

Having studied and worked in Burgundy (and closely with Olivier Leflaive), it's easy to see the Burgundian influence in Stéphane's wines. The mastery of minerality standing shoulder-height with the wood is rarely duplicated in Sancerre. Regardless of his parcels' exposition (many are south-facing), Riffault's wines are always crisp and high-cut with a jeweled sort of delineation that speaks to the precision and attention these wines get.

## SCARECROW

**Scarecrow**, historically the **J.J. Cohn Estate**, is a California wine producer. The estate is located in Rutherford, CA, within the Rutherford AVA in the Napa Valley AVA zone.

In 1943, Joseph Judson Cohn, an MGM executive producer of films such as *The Wizard of Oz* acquired the 195-acre (79 ha) property of Rutherford land adjacent to Inglenook Winery founded by Gustave Niebaum. In 1945 he was persuaded by his neighbor in charge of Inglenook since 1939, John Daniel Jr., to plant grape vines on his estate. 80 acres (32 ha) were planted with Cabernet Sauvignon, and the fruit from the Cohn estate was sold to Inglenook. In later years, the fruit from the J.J. Cohn Estate was sold to Opus One, Joseph Phelps Vineyards, Robert Mondavi Winery and Beaulieu Vineyard.

Cohn died in 1996 aged 100, and the heirs put the then 85-acre (34 ha) property up for sale to resolve the inheritance dispute, and a value estimation at \$4 million in 1996 rose to \$33.6 million by 2002, when Francis Ford Coppola of the Rubicon Estate Winery eventually purchased the property in a package deal with Cohn's grandson Bret Lopez. Coppola got ca. 140 acres (57 ha) including most of the vineyard with 60 planted acres (240,000 m<sup>2</sup>), while Lopez and his partner Mimi DeBlasio received the property buildings, 25 acres of partially planted vineyards and 2 acres (0.81 ha) of the original 1945 Cabernet vines.

The wine's name was decided upon by Lopez and DeBlasio in honor of Cohn. Following the engagement of winemaker Celia Welch, the debut vintage of 2003 became successful, while later vintages have rapidly established Scarecrow as a cult wine.

At the April 2009 Premiere Napa Valley auction, a lot of five cases of Scarecrow was sold for \$80,000. At the February 2011 Premiere Napa Valley auction, a lot of five cases of Scarecrow Wine was sold for \$125,000, breaking previous PNV records.

We love rarity, and Sine Qua Non is rare by design. For every vintage winemaker Manfred Krankl not only makes new wine, but designs a new label and bottle style. Each bottle is a work of art with a name that seems to capture its essence. *Nicliani Cellars is proud to be the importer of Sine Qua Non in the country.*

Sine Qua Non is a California cult winery known for its sought-after Rhône style wine blends, produced in very limited quantities. The winery is located in Ventura County within the Central Coast AVA.

Manfred Krankl and his wife Elaine established the winery in 1994. Sine Qua Non's winery has been described by Robert Parker as "a Mad Max- junkyard dog sort of winery in one of the ugliest sections of Ventura.", while according to Antonio Galloni (Wine Advocate Aug 2011) "the wines that emerge from this site are often profound. The sheer drive for perfection and attention to detail at Sine Qua Non is something I have rarely witnessed anywhere else in the world."

The red wines are based on the varieties of Syrah, Grenache, Mourvedre, and the whites made from Roussanne, Viognier and Chardonnay. In certain vintages, the winery has released a rosé wine.

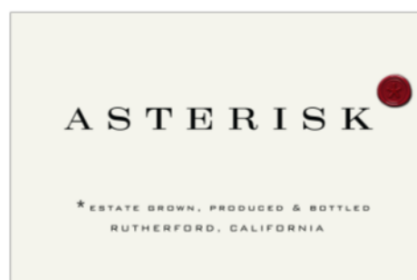

The multi-generational growers, whose descendants arrived here nearly two centuries ago, are the backbone of Torbreck’s winemaking aspirations. Without their knowledge of the seasons and the soil, we would not have such a precious resource of fruit to work with.

Torbreck has also been fortunate to have the opportunity to invest in the protection of some of the Barossa’s most precious vineyards, after accepting fruit from them over many years. The historic Hillside Vineyard at Lyndoch, The Laird Vineyard in the sub-region of Marananga and the Greenock Keller Vineyard owned by the Schultz family, are all now under the custodianship of Torbreck.

# La Place de Bordeaux

Formed of layers of négociants, courtiers and châteaux, La Place de Bordeaux is not a place at all, but the complex distribution system for the region's wines – and increasingly the top wines from around the world.

In Bordeaux, you can't buy wine directly from producers. Instead wines are sold via a complex three-tier system, as they have been since the 17th century. This distribution network – La Place de Bordeaux – is how the wines find their way into markets around the world.

So, how does it work? Château X will sell its wine to a négociant (essentially a wholesaler) via a middleman or broker, known as a courtier – originally introduced to avoid the aristocratic owners of châteaux dealing directly with the merchant classes. The négociant will then sell Château X's wine to merchants around the world – like *Nicliani Cellars* – who then sell the wine on to consumers.

Below you will find a selection of Chateaux that we highly admire and decided to import at the Greek market. Please be **advised that *any potential sales agreements are not applicable.***



# Vins du Monde

For the best part of a millennium the négociants sold only wine made in Bordeaux, until in 1998 the first “foreign” (i.e., non-Bordeaux) wine hit La Place. This was the 1996 vintage of Viña Almaviva, the joint venture between Château Mouton-Rothschild and Chile’s Concha y Toro; that was followed by another Mouton collaboration, Napa’s Opus One, in 2004. Italy’s Masseto and Solaia were listed in 2008 and 2009, Château de Beaucastel’s Hommage à Jacques Perrin was the first non-Bordeaux French wine a couple of years later, then over the last decade we’ve seen Clos Apalta, Catena Zapata, Cheval des Andes from South America, Verité, Inglenook, Joseph Phelps from California; then Luce, Caiarossa, Bibi Graetz and Vin de Constance.

# Le Pin

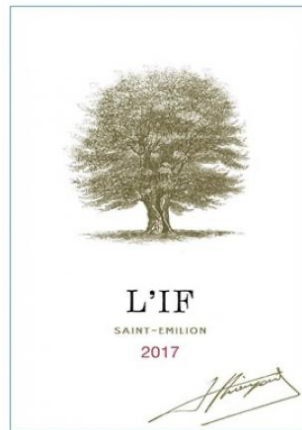
Château Le Pin is, without doubt, one of the most famous names in wine. A vinous icon and one of the three great names of Pomerol alongside Pétrus and Château Lafleur. Today it is one of the rarest, most expensive and finest red wines of Bordeaux – if not the world. Le Pin produces just 600 to 700 cases each year, a truly minuscule quantity that is dwarfed in comparison to the First Growths of the Right Bank. To put this amount into perspective, even the relatively rare neighbouring Pétrus makes around 4000 cases per year.

In 2010 Jacques Thienpont bought a wine estate ideally situated on the plateau of Saint Emilion, facing the village and next to Château Troplong Mondot.

He asked Cyrille, the son of his cousin Nicolas to join him to drive this vineyard. The estate was called Chateau Le Haut-Plantey and the wines were sold under this name and that of Chateau La Bouygue. Today, the vineyard is reborn with the name L' IF – which means Yew Tree.

The first job entailed a complete study of the different soils on the estate which led to important decisions being taken regarding the rootstocks, varieties, cover crops, trellising and canopy management of each individual parcel. L'IF is a work in progress; we are gradually understanding this beautiful vineyard. The precision shown in working each parcel differently both in the vineyard and in the winery is enabling us to make the most out of the varied and complex soils and subsequently bring out the best of the vineyard in the bottle.

## Saint Estephe

Saint-Estèphe is one of the many famous Left Bank red wine appellations of Bordeaux, known for reds based on Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot. Situated at the northern end of the Haut-Médoc region on the gravelly western shores of the Gironde estuary, Saint-Estèphe is separated from its famous neighbor, Pauillac, only by a stream, yet there are significant differences between them. With 1,229 hectares (3036 acres) it accounts for 8 percent of the vineyard area of the Médoc. Because Saint-Estèphe is marginally further from the gravel-bearing waters of the Garonne River, the soil here is far less stony than that found in the southern part of Haut-Médoc. Instead, a heavy clay and limestone base dominates this area, resulting in poorer-draining soils, delayed ripening, and higher acidity levels in the wines.

## Pauillac

Pauillac, a commune located between Saint-Estèphe and Saint-Julien on Bordeaux's Médoc peninsula, is home to some of the world's most famous and expensive red wines, made predominantly from the Cabernet Sauvignon grape variety. The commune gives its name to the Pauillac appellation d'origine contrôlée. The total vineyard area of the appellation covers approximately 1200 hectares (2950 acres). In addition to Cabernet Sauvignon, Cabernet Franc, Merlot, Carmenère, Petit Verdot and Malbec are also permitted for use under the Pauillac appellation laws. The stellar reputation of Pauillac wines is based not only on their quality, but on their success in international fine wine markets. Three of the top five châteaux in the 1855 Médoc Classification are located here: Mouton Rothschild, Lafite Rothschild and Château Latour.

## Saint-Julien

Saint-Julien is a smaller but important red wine appellation of the Haut-Médoc district on the Left Bank of Bordeaux. Its reputation is based on its status as a reliable source of consistently elegant, age-worthy wines. Sandwiched between the more famous appellations of Pauillac and Margaux, Saint-Julien is sometimes unfairly overlooked because it does not have a first growth chateau in the 1855 Bordeaux classification. Pauillac has three of the five Médoc first growths and Margaux has one. Saint-Julien makes up for this by being home to 11 classed growths, which generate three-quarters of the appellation's output. Five of these are highly rated second growths: Châteaux Léoville-Las Cases, Léoville Poyferré, Léoville Barton, Gruaud-Larose and Ducru-Beaucaillou.

## Margaux

Margaux is in the Haut-Médoc district of Bordeaux, southwestern France. Located 25 kilometers (15 miles) north of the city of Bordeaux, the appellation is famous for producing supple, perfumed wines, predominantly from Cabernet Sauvignon. The Margaux appellation contains 21 cru classé properties from the 1855 Bordeaux Classification (20 of which still exist), more than any other Left Bank appellation. It is also, geographically speaking, the largest in the Médoc, and is divided into five communes or parishes. In the north, Soussans borders Pauillac. It boasts no cru classé wines, unlike the commune of Margaux to its south. The latter includes ten cru classé chateaux including first growth Château Margaux, and Château Palmer which is "only" a third growth but regarded as one of the great Bordeaux estates.

## Pessac-Léognan

Pessac-Léognan is a prestigious appellation for red wine in the Bordeaux region of southwestern France. It was carved out of the Graves sub-region in 1987 as recognition for its high-quality red and white wines. Many of the estates in what is now Pessac-Léognan were the best performers in the Graves Classification of 1959. The regions wines tend to be based on the Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc grape varieties. They best suit the terroir of Pessac-Léognan. The dominant soil type is the same gravel (and sand) which gave Graves its name. The red grape varieties of the appellation cover approximately 1491 hectares (3684 acres). Pessac-Léognan's white wines are made predominantly from Sauvignon Blanc (a required minimum of 25 percent) and Semillon grapes with a total of 275 hectares (679 acres) of white varieties reported. This duo thrives on the sandier soils of the appellation and produce extremely long-lived wines. In other regions and countries, blends of Sauvignon Blanc and Semillon are usually best consumed within a few years of harvest. The wines are often matured in oak for greater complexity.

## Saint-Émilion

Saint-Émilion is an appellation and key wine town in the Libournais district of Bordeaux, important in terms of both quality and quantity. The most searched-for Saint-Émilion wine on our database is Château Cheval Blanc. The town lies just a few miles north of the Dordogne, in the final stages of the river's journey from the hills of the Massif Central to the Gironde estuary. It is renowned as much for its beautiful buildings and scenery as for its wine. Its steep, narrow, cobbled streets, overlooked by its Romanesque church and the iconic 13th-century Tour du Roy tower are a reminder of the town's long history. There have vineyards around Saint-Émilion since Roman times, and today the Saint-Émilion wine appellation is one of the most prolific in the Bordeaux region, generating more than 250,000hl of wine each vintage. It is also responsible for some of the most prestigious, long-lived, and expensive wines in the world – châteaux Cheval Blanc, Ausone, Angélu, Figeac and Pavie, are all situated in and around Saint-Émilion. Only red wine qualifies for the appellation; a little dry white wine is made within the appellation borders, but it must be labeled as Bordeaux Blanc.

## Pomerol

Cross the river, and the story is a little different. St. Emilion is a patchwork of both property and style; continue to Pomerol and it is as if you're in a different region. At 800 or so hectares, Pomerol is roughly the same size as St Julien, though that is where the similarities end. Take just five St Julien properties: Lagrange, Gruaud-Larose and Leovilles Poyferre and Lascases, and you've filled half of the Pomerol vineyards. Pomerol is much more Burgundian in its make up: an appellation in Bordeaux where the vigneronns are true artisans. This artisanal edge runs throughout the region, from Lafleur and Le Pin to the lesser-known properties.

## Sauternes | Barsac

The classic Sauternes wine has an intense golden color (darker than most other dessert wines), which turns a deep amber as it ages in bottle. The aromas include blossom and stone fruit, with a hint of honeysuckle – the trademark of botrytized wines. The best wines balance sweetness with acidity, concentration with freshness, and power with elegance. Although some wineries here produce dry wines, they sell them under appellations other than the sweet-specific Sauternes appellation. Sauternes' wines are made mostly from the Sémillon grape variety, which accounts for about eight in every 10 vines in the local vineyards. Sauvignon Blanc accounts for much of the remaining vineyard area and is the dominant variety in just a small handful of Sauternes wines. The total reported vineyard area for the appellation is approximately 1557 hectares.
